



Bird Walks in Brisbane's Inner West

Saturday, 7th September 2019—6:30am(!) start

Bird Walk on Land for Wildlife Properties, Fig Tree Pocket

It's time for one of our best birding sites in Brisbane's inner west. We are again guests on private Land for Wildlife properties known for their abundance of native fauna and especially avian life. We will observe birds and see changes of species and abundance following seasonal and altitudinal migration. Registration is essential.

Where: We'll provide the address latest on the day before the birding event.

Saturday, 21st September 2019—7:00am start

Bird Walk at Clarina Street Park, Chapel Hill

This walk will be a first in the mentioned location and is intended to assess birdlife on site and to observe changes over time following rehabilitation work conducted. The site is an important bushland remnant and part of the *Witton for Wilife* fauna movement corridor.

Where: Meeting place at Clarina Street Park entrance in Clarina Street, Chapel Hill

Thursday, 14th November 2019—7:00am start

Bird Walk at the Chapel Hill reach of Mount Coot-tha

We chose a weekday because the walking tracks are very popular on the weekend. This way we will be able to listen to bird calls a little more than would otherwise be possible. Naturally, the mount is a haven for birds and always a joy to explore.

Where: Meeting point is the parking space off Fleming Road, opp. Greenford St, Chapel Hill

Saturday, 14th December 2019—7:00am start

Bird Walk at Toowong Creek's upper reaches

Will we hear the Channel-billed cuckoo again at this site? It is the time of the year. What better way to enjoy a beautiful natural location close to the city, see the progress of rehabilitation, and observe changes in avian populations. '

Where: Cnr Kent Street/Broseley Road, Toowong (approach via Crag Road,)
