Free CWCN Workshop Native Edible & Medicinal Plants

Australia's environment harbours an abundance of edible native plants. Tubers, berries, leaves, seeds and other parts of nutritious plants were used to supplement the diet of Aborigines. In desert country they even provided the majority of food and kept people healthy. Much of the knowledge is lost, although some is mentioned in the accounts of the early explorers. Kemp Kill-erby from *Flora4Fauna* will give us an animated introduction into the many uses of native plants and encourage us to establish, indigenous plants, healthy for us and good for fauna.

We all know tea tree oil as a powerful antiseptic, yet we know very little about traditional Australian medicine. Who is aware of the Kakadu Plum having 50 times the vitamin C content of oranges, of plants treating headaches, wounds, and fungal skin infections, easing rheumatoid arthritis, of the Blushwood tree in northern Queensland showing potential to treat certain cancers, and so forth? Kemp will discuss these plant uses too.

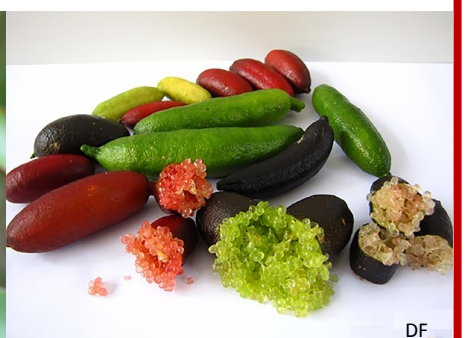
