Mistletoes are often maligned, yet they are not only of exceptional beauty but also a vital part of our ecosystems. They support birds, insects and other fauna. In return, pollination and fruit dispersal of most mistletoes rely on fauna. They are selective when it comes to host plants (mostly trees) and are considered keystone species in our forests and woodlands.

Although usually not known, we have an abundance of different mistletoe species in Brisbane. There is a lot to be learnt about these plants, and a lot of myths are to be dispelled. This workshop is for everyone interested in biodiversity and ecosystems, and equally suited for bird and butterfly lovers, for rehabilitators on public and private land wanting to know more about nature's interaction or just revel at the beauty exhibited by stunningly different mistletoes.

Dr John T. Moss will run our workshop and guide a field excursion to a nearby area with several different species. John is the co-author of the highly acclaimed "*The Mistletoes of Subtropical Queensland, New South Wales and Victoria*". John has a particular interest and love for fascinating yet poorly researched areas of local insects and plants.

This workshop is free. Preference will be given to members of BCC's Community Conservation Partnerships Program (Catchment Groups, Habitat Brisbane, Land for Wildlife) and Educators from our local schools. **Morning tea** will be provided.
