The fascinating world of fungi are at the centre of fourth workshop in CWCN's series about local biodiversity. **Ecologist, field mycologist and co-author of *Australian Subtropical Fungi* (2014), Dr Sapphire McMullen-Fisher** will guide attendees through the second largest kingdom of organisms and talk about these immensely effective networkers in our natural surrounds. Sapphire will explain the difference between fungal recyclers (around three quarters of all fungi), parasites and those fungi which enter into a mutually beneficial relationship with roots of most plants. She will talk about the importance of fungi as food source for vertebrates and invertebrates, their importance to soil health and for carbon capture, the potential they hold for medicinal and other applications. This workshop will introduce participants to an often neglected part of our natural world and highlight some amazing facts linked to the functioning of ecosystems. It will also cover fungal identification basics and include a walk in local bushland.

This workshop is free. Preference will be given to members of BCC's Community Conservation Partnerships Program (Catchment Groups, Habitat Brisbane, Land for Wildlife) and Educators from our local schools. Morning tea and lunch snacks will be provided.
