Saturday, 8th September 2018 – Bird Walk on LfW Properties in Fig Tree Pocket

Join us for one of our favourite walks on connected Land for Wildlife properties. The sites have been under rehabilitation for many years, consist of a variety of habitats, are rich in general not only avian biodiversity and located alongside the Brisbane River. Their biodiversity is extraordinary, partly because these sites are again connected to further large properties with natural habitat. Unfortunately, all this land is zoned as emerging communities and threatened by development. The walk will be guided by Lyn Cole and the property owners. BYO binoculars and water bottle. Wear protective clothing and sturdy shoes, the latter especially because the terrain is uneven.

Habitat above Witton Creek has already been transformed and is further being repaired and expanded over a large site. Will we see the pardalotes again or the little fairy wrens.....? Lyn Cole will be guiding the bird walk and share her rich knowledge about birds and plants. BYO binoculars and water bottle. Wear protective clothing and sturdy shoes, the terrain is uneven. Be on time. For security reasons, the gates will be locked.
