Budding Birders at Biami Yumba Park

All young nature lovers are invited to participate. We are back at one of our favourite spots. The waterfowl at Biami Yumba Park are large enough and move slower than your average birds in the wild. Budding birders have time to observe. BYO binoculars or use those provided by CWCN. Thanks to *Birds Queensland* we'll also have illustrated lists to make ticking off sightings much easier and for participants to count the amazing diversity of bird species they'll encounter.

There will also be some fun activities to figure out how a variety of beaks is suited to tackle different food types and how bird feet help to support actions in specific environments.

There is lots to learn about fruit bats as well as insectivorous ones, about what they are, where they live, how they forage, what they eat, what makes good habitat, where there are threats endangering them, and why they are important. Learning while having fun with multi-layered activities provides excitement. We'll play a game that will lead you through different habitats types for bats. To progress you'll need to do 'batty' activities and present your bat knowledge to reach the bat haven. Of course, after dark we'll go for a walk and use a bat detector too. Protective clothing must be worn. – This activity is part of the *Australasian Bat Night*.
